

## Reader's report grants

FILI's reader's report grant programme promotes the translation and publication of Finnish literature abroad. It is aimed for publishers who are considering publishing Finnish literature in translation and will have a written report on books given by a professional reader or readers.

**Publishers from outside Finland** can apply the grant to commission a reader's report on adult or children's/YA fiction or non-fiction books published in Finland.

The grant may be applied for **a maximum of 5 reader's reports per year**. More than one report can be commissioned for the same book.

The applications are:

- **submitted via an online application form at FILI's website.**
- **accepted on a rolling basis and considered individually.**
- **handled confidentially – details will not be given to third parties.**

The grant is:

- **max. €100 for one reader's report.**
- **max. €500 / publisher per year.**
- **valid for 6 months after being awarded.**

The applicants must state:

- **which book(s) they are commissioning the report(s) on.**
- **the person writing the report(s).**
- **that the fee will be paid to the same person as identified on the grant application.**

The successful applicants will receive the grant into the account stated on the application form after the publisher has forwarded the completed report(s) to FILI.

In order to receive their grant payments the **applicants must return a signed copy of the agreement sent by FILI** as required under the Finnish Act on Discretionary Government Transfers.
